2023 was a strange year. Despite a rising solar flux the conditions on our weekend were terrible. Virtually every soapbox comment mentioned it. As a result there were very few contacts on 15m and almost none on 10m. Logs received were down slightly by 13%. However, there was lots of activity on both phone and CW.

Normally we have about 200 of our 259 counties available on the 7QP weekend. This year we did better than usual with 217 showing up at one time or another. Some of the hits were simply someone showing up on the air and not knowing what was

going on, giving their

county and then retreating to a WARC band. ON means just that. CFM is the number of counties that turned in logs. All the rest are determined by examining the received logs. This is the best example I can give as to why it is important to send in your log, no matter how slim it is.
